1. Administration

1.1 Regulations

- a) This WA Sporting Car Club (WASCC) Race Event will be held under the current:
 - i. FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices.
 - ii. Motorsport Australia Manual - National Competition Rules
 - iii. Motorsport Australia Manual - Circuit Race Standing Regulations
 - iv. Motorsport Australia WA Motor Race Sporting Regulations
 - v. These Supplementary Regulations and any amendments, Further Regulations, Event Bulletins.
- b) WASCC Events will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Safety 1st, Integrity and Legal, and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au
- c) Medical requirements will be in accordance with General Appendix Medical Services Article 3.1.4.3.
- d) The Event shall be a:
 - **State Championship Circuit Race Event**

1.3 Circuit Details

- a) Location: Wattle Avenue East, NEERABUP, WA 6031
- b) Length and Direction: CARCO.com.au Raceway Long Circuit: (FIA International Grade 3) 2.4150 kilometers – clockwise direction with asphalt surface.

1.4 Insurance

- a) Certain public, property, professional indemnity, and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at www.motorsport.org.au
- b) Every entrant and driver must sign the Disclaimers and Entrants Statement on the Entry Form before taking part in any competition event. This shall include a statement attesting that the entered automobile conforms to its applicable eligibility criteria and is in a fit state for the proposed competition.

1.5 Official Sign-on and Briefing

Officials sign-on will be held at the Race Office at a time provided by the organiser.

2. Entries

2.1 Drivers

- a) Racing competitors must hold the minimum of a Motorsport Australia Circuit License with provisional endorsement.

2.2 Categories (and Classes) of Automobiles Admitted

Race: The competition will be conducted for the below categories of automobiles complying with the Categories of the Motorsport Australia Manual under Circuit Race and Historic appendices.

- HQ
- Production Cars
- Formula Vee
- Improved Production Cars
- Street Cars
- WA Muscle Car's (3TA TransAm/3D Sports Sedans complying with 2023 WA Muscle Car Regulations)
- Sports Cars/Sports Sedans
- Saloon Cars

2.3 Entry Lodgment

- a) Entries open on publication of these Supplementary Regulations.
- b) Entry forms are to be lodged via the Motorsport Australia online entry system www.motorsport.org.au/login (Member Portal) before the closing time and date of 4pm, Monday 24/07/2023.
- c) With the submission of their entry, the competitor(s) give their agreement, also on behalf of their driver(s), pit crew and sponsors, that the organiser may record all activities in connection with the event and have them transmitted by radio, television, or other media. No claims against the organiser or the transmission company may be raised.
- d) Attendance at the Race Office prior to the driver's qualifying session is still necessary for those competitors who wish to add pit crew to their form.
- e) Late Entries:
 - i. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Event Organiser, up to 48 hours after the event closing date, late entries will close on the 26/07/2023 at 4pm.
 - ii. All entries accepted under this circumstance will incur a \$50 late entry administration fee.

2.4 Entry Fees

- a) Fees for entry are as follows:

i.	Driver Racing Entry (WASCC Member)	\$295
ii.	Driver Racing Entry (Non-Member)	\$415
iii.	Carport Hire	\$40 payable with entry fee
iv.	Dorian Hire per car	\$25 payable with entry fee
v.	Saloon Cars/3E Production Cars Enduro (inc. Two Drivers)	\$500
- b) Please Note:
 - i. All Entry Fees **MUST** be received on or prior to the closing date of entries of the event.
 - ii. Any competitor who withdraws from a WASCC event prior to the event closing date will be entitled to a full refund.
 - Note: all refunds will be processed within 5 working days after the completion of the event.
 - iii. Any competitor whose withdrawal is received after the event closing date but before the Tuning Day will incur a \$50 admin fee with the balance to be held in credit.
 - Note: if the competitor volunteers as an official for the race event, they shall have the full \$50 admin fee credited into their account.
 - iv. Any competitor whose withdrawal is received after the Tuning Day but before the Event Briefing will incur a \$155 admin fee with the balance to be held in credit.
 - Note: if a WASCC member volunteers as an official for the race event, they shall have the full \$155 admin fee credited into their account.

- Note: if a non-member volunteers as an official for the race event, they shall have \$50 of the \$155 admin fee credited into their account.
- c) No refund credit or other will be offered after commencement of the drivers briefing. Acceptance and Oversubscribed Entries:
 - i. Where the category entry list exceeds the track density for that category, entries shall be accepted based on order of receipt.
 - ii. Competitors will be given the option to receive conditional acceptance and be placed on a reserve entry list if another competitor withdraws.
 - iii. Competitors who do not accept this option will receive a full refund of the entry fee paid.

2.5 Refusal of Entries

- a) The Organisers reserve the right to refuse entry in accordance with the NCR.

2.6 General

- a) Trailers, tow trucks and transporters are not to be parked in the paddock area.
- b) The loading of automobiles in the paddock areas must only be done after the last race of the day.
- c) Automobiles may be loaded prior to the last event in the trailer compound north of the Groundman's shed or south of the Arise Racing shed.
- d) Golf buggies and WASCC approved modes of transport "ONLY" are permitted in the paddock area.
- e) This Event may include a parade in accordance with the NCR.
- f) The official noticeboard is located within the Race Office.

3. Document Check

3.1 Competition Licenses

- a) All Drivers will have their Motorsport Australia licenses checked through the Motorsport Australia electronic platform.
- b) Drivers must comply to the Motorsport Australia General Appendix Licenses document.

3.2 Driver's Briefing

- a) A time and place for the Drivers Briefing will be indicated on the timetable.

3.3 Automobile Logbook Check

- a) All logbooks must be submitted to the category-labelled bucket located outside the scrutineering shed.
- b) At the conclusion of the event, drivers or pit crew must retrieve the logbook from the scrutineering shed.

4. Scrutineering

4.1 Motorsport Australia Targeted Scrutiny

- a) Automobiles will be examined throughout the competition as per the

5. Competition Procedures

5.1 Determination of Winner

- a) Points for each race shall be allocated to the driver for each race / trial as per the following table.

- b) The winner will be determined by the competitor with the highest accrued points on the day.

5.2 Trophies

Trophies may be presented at the completion of the event.

Trophies will be awarded as follows:

- a) Minimum 3 driver field = 1st place trophy only.
- b) Minimum 6 driver field = 1st and 2nd place trophies.
- c) Minimum 9 driver field = 1st, 2nd, 3rd place trophies.

5.3 Starting Procedures

- a) Unless stated elsewhere in these regulations, Further Regulations or category appendices, all races will be non-championship standing starts.
 - i. For a standing start one (1) crew member per car is permitted to remain on the pit wall to provide directions to the driver until they come under the starter's orders.
 - ii. For rolling starts, each vehicle must form up into a 2x2 formation between Flag Points 8 and 9 (Near where the Short Circuit re-joins the track on the back straight). Accelerating, braking, and moving left or right must cease beyond Flag Point 9.
- b) Sports Sedans / Sports Cars / WA Muscle Car's: All races to commence from a non-championship rolling start as per CRSR 5.5 and WA Motor Race Championship Regulations.
- c) FSR: All races commence from a non-championship rolling start as per CRSR 5.5 with an initial out lap from dummy grid passing by the start finish line once before commencing their start.

5.4 Grid Positions

- a) Unless stated elsewhere in these Regulations, Further Regulations or category appendices, all grid positions will be:
 - i. **First race** – from qualifying times, with the fastest qualifier to pole.
 - ii. **Second race** – on the finishing order from Race 1.
 - iii. **Third race** – on the finishing order from Race 2.

5.5 Event Lengths

- Unless stated elsewhere in these regulations or Further Regulations, race lengths for HQ,

Formula Vee, IPC, and Street Cars categories will be:

- a) Race 1 and 3: 8 laps
- b) Race 2: 10 Laps

Sports Sedans, Sports Cars, WA Muscle Car's

- a) Race 1 and 2: 15 laps

1 Saloon Cars/Production Cars Enduro

1.1. Vehicle and Driver Eligibility

- a) Eligible Vehicles will be:
 - i. 3K Saloon Cars (Pro and Pro Am)
 - ii. 3E Production Cars
- b) Drivers may only compete in one (1) vehicle

1.2. Event Format

- a) The event will be conducted as follows:
 - a) 2 x 10-minute qualifying
 - 1) Qualifying 1 – Driver A
 - 2) Qualifying 2 – Driver B
 - b) Race 1 and 2 – 5 Laps
 - c) Race 3 – 40 laps with a time certain finish of 60 minutes +1 lap
Includes Compulsory Pit Stop
- b) All competitors to nominate Driver A and Driver B at the driver's briefing with the Event Secretary prior to commencement of the day's event.
- c) All Competitors to nominate starting driver for all races with the Event Secretary within thirty (30) minutes of the conclusion of qualifying.

1.3. Grid Determination

- I. Race 1 – from combined qualifying results, fastest lap per car to pole.
- II. Race 2 – on the finishing order of Race 1
- III. Race 3 – on the finishing order of Race 2

1.4. Determination of Winner

The winner of the event will be the winner of Race 3 in each eligible category:

- i. 3K Saloon Cars (Pro)
- ii. 3K Saloon Cars (Pro Am)
- iii. 3E Production Cars

1.5. Compulsory Pit Stop

- a) Compulsory pit stop procedure will be in accordance with CRSR 5.11 PIT STOP
- b) All competitors will be required to do a minimum of one (1) compulsory pit stop (CPS) with a minimum stationary time of **sixty (60) seconds**.
- c) The CPS window will be open when the lead automobile crosses the control line to complete lap (10) and will close when the lead automobile crosses the control line to complete lap thirty (30). The opening and closing of the CPS will be signaled in the starters box by a sign and siren to be shown to persons in the lane.

Note: Stops are allowed outside this window but will not count towards the CPS requirement.

- d) All persons including the additional driver must stay within the confines of their allocated pit bay during the CPS.

*Note: As per CRSR 5.11.3 a maximum of **four (4)** persons are permitted per automobile, one of these persons must be the dedicated to the role of car controller and this person is prohibited from performing any other function during the CPS.*

- e) Single Driver Entries will be required to exit the automobile during the CPS.
- f) There will be **NO** Refueling permitted during the event.

Pit Lane & Paddock

- b) The paddock area is defined as any non-competition area within the facility.
- c) The speed limit within the Paddock area is 15kph.
- d) The Pit Lane speed limit is 40kph.

5.6 Parc Ferme

Parc Ferme will be in the scrutineering area at the south end of the paddock area.

5.7 Protests

Competitors are reminded of their right to protest in accordance with the conditions outlined in the NCR of the Motorsport Australia Manual.

5.8 Integrity

Motorsport Australia's National Integrity Framework and any associated policy (including the Australian Anti- Doping Policy, Motorsport Australia's Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy, the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy), apply to any activity authorised by Motorsport Australia as published at motorsport.org.au.

Any Participant including the holder of a Motorsport Australia License (or a License issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol, any drug or other banned substance. In addition to any penalty imposed by Motorsport Australia, a further penalty/s may be applied by Sport Integrity Australia.

5.9 Smoking

CARCO.com.au Raceway has strict 'no-smoking' areas in accordance with WA statutes and designated areas including the Paddock and pit areas.

Smoking (which includes e-cigarettes and "vaping") and any naked flame is prohibited within 3 meters of any.
refueling/defueling operation

5.10 Alcohol

- 5.11** Consumption of alcohol in any Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day.

5.12 Postponement, Abandonment and Cancellations of Competition

The Organiser reserves the right to abandon, postpone or stop the Event in accordance with the NCR.
